Dear Parents, Carers and Families,

As we come to the end of the Autumn Term, I am writing to you as Chair of governors to reflect on what has been a **very positive and successful term** for Lyngford Park Primary & Nursery.

Firstly, I would like to thank you all for the continued support you give to the school. Strong partnerships between home and school make a real difference, and this term has shown just how much can be achieved when we work together.

A Term of Real Progress and Pride

One of the most encouraging highlights this term has been the school's **academic performance**. Recently released Department for Education data confirms that Lyngford Park's **three-year trend in Reading, Writing and Maths is strongly positive**. Not only are we now broadly **in line with the national average in Reading and Maths**, but we are also **above the Somerset average** in these key areas. This represents a significant improvement from three years ago and is something the whole school community should feel proud of. It is clear evidence of the hard work and commitment shown by pupils, staff and leaders alike.

Attendance remains a key focus for the school, with a target of 95%. While whole-school attendance currently stands at 93%, this still reflects positive progress, and governors fully support the school's ongoing work with families to ensure every child benefits from being in school as much as possible.

We are also pleased to see Lyngford Park's **growing reputation within the local community**. Demand for Reception places for September 2026 is already very high, with only a small number of places remaining. This is a strong indicator of the confidence families place in the school and its continued improvement.

Enriching Experiences and a Strong Community

Alongside academic success, governors are delighted by the wide range of **enrichment opportunities** provided this term. Pupils have enjoyed visits to local farms and libraries, as well as engaging workshops delivered by organisations such as the **RSPCA**. These experiences enrich learning, broaden children's understanding of the world and support their personal development in meaningful ways.

This term has also seen **new members of staff join the Lyngford Park team**. Governors are pleased with how warmly they have been welcomed and with the positive contribution they have already made to school life, further strengthening the provision for our children.

As we approach the end of term, it has been wonderful to see the school filled with the spirit of Christmas. **Seasonal activities, events and celebrations** have created many happy moments for pupils and staff alike, helping to make the final weeks of term both memorable and enjoyable.

Looking Ahead

The recently released **new OFSTED inspection framework** will bring a renewed focus on a number of areas, including attendance. Governors are confident that the school is well-placed to meet these expectations and will continue to work closely with school leaders to support ongoing development.

Celebrating Our School Community

I would also like to recognise the fantastic efforts of the **PTFA**, who have worked hard this term to organise events such as discos and raffles. Not only do these events raise valuable funds for the school, but they also help to strengthen our sense of community and create enjoyable experiences for the children.
